Hungarian National Tv aired a documentary made of her carrier and was entered at the Australian Film Festival.

Ms. Ducsay toured internationally in Korea, Japan and Australia.

She has co-chaired fundraisers benefiting 2 schools.

From 2009-2014 she has been part of the Joffrey Academy in Chicago, teaching in the pre-professional and Trainee division. Her students got into professional schools such as: ABT, SAB, PNB In companies: ABT, Joffrey, Ballet Met, Polish national ballet.
